





He migrated with his wife to Australia in 1946. The scarcely seen Third Edition, rarer still with a lengthy inscription by Charles in Blissymbols and English.

The Catholic Encyclopedia designates this edition “the latest and best” of the Vulgate Glosses containing all of the exegetical apparatus by Nicholas of Lyra, Paulus Burgensis (Paul of Burgos), Matthias Toringus, and many others. Misattributed to the Benedictine monk Walafrid Strabo (since the 20th century attributed to the French theologian Anselm of Laon and his followers), edited by the Welsh Benedictine monk and scholar Leander a. S. Martino [John Jones] (1575-1636), and published by Johannes Meursius. Engraved title page after Jan Collaert II after Peter Paul Rubens, with others after Rubens.




Complete in six volumes with the usual mispaginations and collates as per STCV 6822607 excepting vol.3: 4A8 is blank (not noted in STCV), vol. 4: lacking the final blank leaf (b4), vol. 5 includes 2T6 (which the STCV copy lacks and is blank as suggested), vol. 6: with the index and errata bound in at the start of Chapter 2 and lacking the final blank leaf (3T8), so collates as: A10 a6 e6 i6 B-3T7. Aged repairs to the spines leaving the lettering and decoration largely dulled. Minor rubbing and cracking to the joints though still very sturdy. Short, though generally with ample margin excepting: vol. 1: tail of G5 cropped; vol. 2: G6 a little short, and KK5 very slightly cropped (the final marginal notes only). Very occasional minor marginal crease, tear, or chip. Minor to moderate tanning in places, a few leaves on the heavier side, and some of the engravings with some offsetting. 


Signed and numbered illustrated edition, specially produced by Chinthurst Fine books to celebrate the 85th birthday of Nelson Mandela on the 18th of July, 2003. Bound in full brown morocco by monastically trained bookbinders at Abbey Bookbindery in Surrey, England, with a matching clamshell presentation case containing a drawer of 4 signed lithographed photographic prints on art paper by South African photographer Grant Warren. The prints show views of Robben Island produced from a 2002 trip by Warren and Mandela where Mandela drew a series of sketches related to his political imprisonment there and later exhibited by Belgravia Gallery. An intended production of 950 numbered copies, only 250 were produced, of which this is number 74. This copy also includes 12 postcards produced by Touch Galleries Sydney reproducing Mandela's sketches and quotes as well as the Touch Galleries catalogue for an exhibition of limited edition lithographs of the sketches, and this limited edition book.

The first and only print edition of the encyclopaedic magnum opus of Australian ethnobotanist Snu Voogelbreinder in which is explored "the vast world of psychoactive plants, animals and other organisms, and their uses in shamanism, spiritual exploration and healing. Encompassing scientific research, personal experience, ancient knowledge and esoteric philosophies, a multidisciplinary approach is taken, giving a wide view of the effects of natural substances on the mind, with an emphasis towards beneficial outcomes. Preliminary information is given regarding neurochemistry, drug-free consciousness alteration, and methods of use, from cultivation or wild-sourcing through to harvesting, processing, consumption, and navigation of the effects. Thousands of species from over 1700 genera are discussed, with over 440 genera covered in greater detail, including botanical and zoological descriptions. Also included are a detailed index of natural chemicals of particular interest, and a huge bibliography containing thousands of reference entries." (rear cover) Initially published in a limited run of 500 copies, less were distributed due to printing errors. Only 2 copies held in institutions, at Purdue University and the National Library of Australia.

"Terra II was produced in Folsom Prison in the fall of 1973 by Leary and co-prisoner Benner, with the illustrations done by another prisoner, Harold Olson. The subject of the work is the evolution/migration from Terra I (Planet Earth) to Terra II (an orbiting space colony between Earth and the Moon). Joanna Leary, publisher of the book, and a Sacramento newspaper woman reporter using the pseudonym Guanine, are credited with co-authorship. Like the monographs Neurologic and Starseed, the proceeds of the sale of Terra II were intended to help pay expenses of costly legal appeals by Leary to win his freedom from prison." Suck was touted as the first European sex newspaper and tasked itself with creating "a new pornography which would demystify male and female bodies". Launched in London in 1969 before moving to Amsterdam to avoid England's anti-obscenity laws. Heathcote Williams in his Suck manifesto declares "SUCK is Group Sex, Police Sex, Animal Sex, Teeny Sex, One Armed Bandit Sex, Geriatric Sex and Cosmic Sex", highlighting the nothing is off-limits approach of the editorial board. Though Suck was no mere porno rag, as Australian feminist writer and Suck co-founder Germaine Greer told the academic journal *Women's Studies International Forum*, Suck was "a new kind of erotic art, away from the tits 'n' ass and the peep-show syndrome." Greer's involvement helped push a wave of radical feminist pornography, though she fell out with her co-editors and resigned after they published a photograph of her naked with her legs over her head, not because of the nudity, but the context of its publishing, which is outlined in Greer's resignation letter printed in the final issue. Greer's involvement was not the only tip to a radical cause with noted contributors including William S. Burroughs, Valerie Solanas, Michael McClure, W. H. Auden, Guillaume Apollinaire, Maurice Girodias, and many others. Primary editors were William Levy, Heathcote Williams, Germaine Greer, Susan Jansen, Lynne Tillman, and Jim Haynes, with art direction by Willem de Ridder.







What in fact arose was a conflict between the desires of women who came to meet and discuss politics, and the structure of the conference which allowed only short workshops and resolution-making assemblies. Both the conference structure and the position paper in the registration packet reflected unmistakably the politics of the Socialist Workers Party" (from introduction). A defining moment of the conference was the conflict surrounding one of the opening night cultural entertainment performers, trans lesbian folk singer Beth Elliott, previously vice-president of the San Francisco chapter of the Daughters of Bilitis, who was opposed by lesbian-separatist group The Gutter Dykes, resulting in a vote on ejecting Elliott from the conference because of her trans status. Elliott stayed on and performed, and despite reports that a majority voted for allowing her to stay (contrary to what the introduction to this printing implies), left the conference shortly after. Morgan amended her speech to address the controversy, critical of Elliott and the conference organisers. OCLC records 5 holdings of 4 different editions, none verifiably of this Sisterhood Books printing.

(Christoph Antons: *Foster v Mountford: Cultural Confidentiality in a Changing Australia in Landmarks in Australian Intellectual Property Law*, CUP 2009). Mountford was by no means insensitive and on page 6 as well as on an inserted leaf (not present with this copy) notes "Where Australian Aborigines are concerned, and in areas where traditional Aboriginal religion is still significant, this book should be used only after consultation with local male religious leaders. This restriction is important. It is imposed because the concept of what is secret, or may not be revealed to the uninitiated in Aboriginal religious belief and action, varies considerably throughout the Australian continent: and because the varying views of Aborigines in this respect must on all occasions be observed." CAINS 121.
